Support

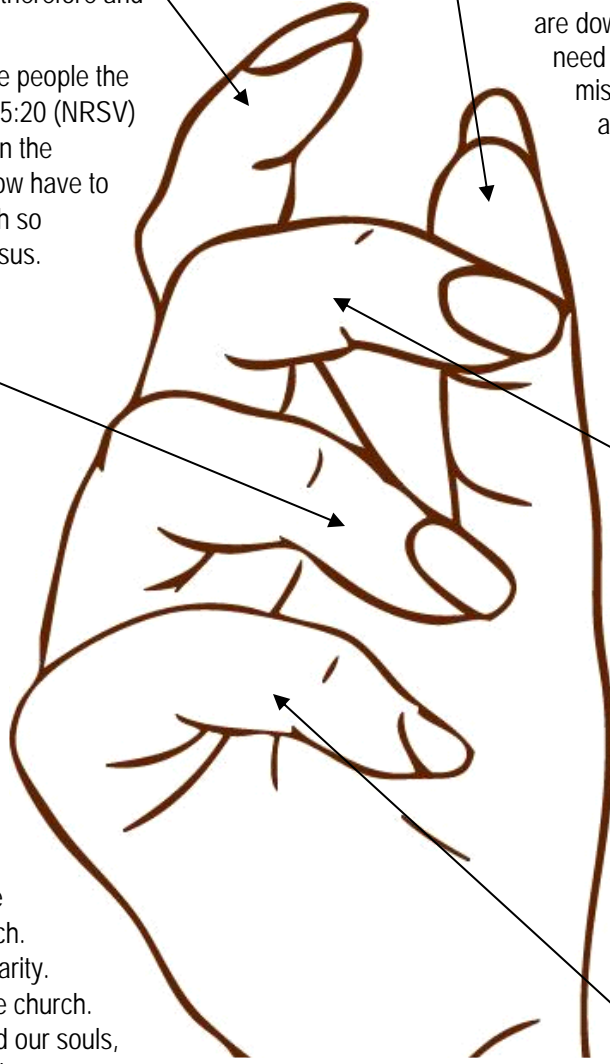

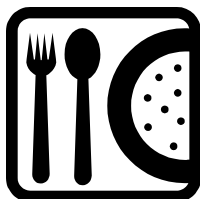

Bev's Table

What We're All About

For those of us that are old enough to remember the "good old days" we might recall that eighty one years ago this country was hit by the "Crash of '29"! This was a financial disaster that caused the "Great Depression" when the stock market plunged from the highs of the "Roaring Twenties" to near zero value. Many large corporations and smaller companies went bankrupt throwing their employees out of work and those that remained cut their labor force. This caused many banks to fail leaving many of their depositors without a penny! By 1933, 25% of the work force were unemployed and with little or no money and in some cases no place to live!

People stood in "bread lines" to receive food or coupons to feed their families while the worst drought in modern American history brought farmers to their knees as the rainless, stifling hot summers killed off their crops. The only things that were plentiful were grasshoppers that swarmed by the millions everywhere.

My late wife's Dad, Oscar Volden, was a Minnesota farmer and he died in 1933 right in the middle of this disaster leaving her Mom, Bev, her sister and brother alone on the farm. Her Mom sold the farm and the animals for what she could get, which wasn't much, but was enough to get a small house in a nearby town. She did whatever it took to keep the family together, scrubbing floors on her hands and knees and taking care of other children and their houses. All during those next years however, they never missed church or giving whatever change they had to the offering plate. They spent much of their "free time" helping friends and neighbors that were having trouble. Bev learned how to give and throughout her life she never failed to reach out to someone in need.

Last fall we first heard about the growing number of people in the Stuart area who were becoming "homeless" and living under the bridges and out in the woods around the city. Bev's reaction was "we need to do something!" So, Bev's Table began providing \$25 Food Only cards for those in desperate need. These cards are given by two churches in the area, Immanuel and the Jensen Beach Christian Church. Those that receive the cards are given the food card, a devotional and a note of prayer, thanks to these two churches. The cost is covered by special gifts from people in and outside the community. Immanuel has also begun a Sunday evening dinner open to the public and Jensen Beach does this at a Sunday breakfast and a Thursday dinner.

As Jesus said, "When you help the least of your brothers, you are helping me". This is what our church is all about — Jesus and reaching out to help others!

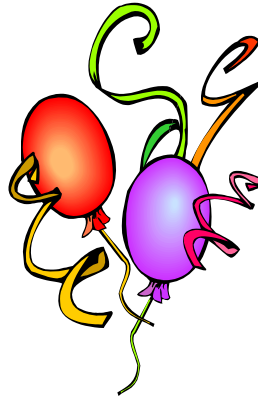
